MINUTES OF THE 30th MEETING OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE HELD ON 15-06-2021 AT 11:00 A.M. THROUGH ONLINE MODE AT RAJIV GANDHI NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF LAW, PUNJAB, PATIALA.

Professor (Dr.) G.S. Bajpai, Vice-Chancellor (Chairperson) welcomed the Members of the Finance Committee and thanked them for taking out valuable time from their busy schedule for joining online meeting.

At the outset, the Members of the Finance Committee welcomed and conveyed best wishes to new Vice-Chancellor, Prof (Dr.) G.S. Bajpai.

Prof (Dr.) Naresh Kumar Vats, Registrar (Secretary) presented the agenda of the meeting. The following decisions were taken by the Finance Committee:

ITEM (1) To confirm of the proceedings of the previous meeting of the Finance Committee which was held on 25.03.2021 (Annexure-1).



Note

The previous meeting of the Finance Committee was held on 25.03.2021. As such, the Proceedings and Action Taken Report of the said meeting are placed before the Hon'ble Members of the Finance Committee for kind perusal and approval please.

Decision

The Finance Committee confirmed the Minutes and Action Taken Report of the previous meeting of the Finance Committee held on 25.03.2021 (Annexre-1).

With regard to Item No. 4, the Finance Committee unanimously decided to review its decision taken in the previous meeting held on 25.03.2021, subject to its approval by Executive Council. Considering the recommendations of Hostel Maintenance Assessment Committee and Fee Rationalization Committee and to bring a parity in relief to all students, the Finance Committee resolved that the proposed waiver is ascertained to be Rs. 12,09,560/-to LL.M. Students which is as under:

- (i) The LL.M. Students be allowed the relief total Rs. 6,54,368/- which comes out of Rs. 14,872/- per head.
- (ii) As worked out by Hostel
 Maintenance Assessment
 Committee the maintenance cost of
 Hostel i.e., Rs. 4,23,192 will be setoff against waiver by the University.
- (iii) Amounting Rs. 1,32,000/- i.e., Rs. 3000/- per head has already been waived by Finance Committee / Executive Council in its meeting held in 20.06.2020 (Para-2) for LL.M. students batch 2020.

The above relief/waiver are allowed subject to the approval of Executive Council.



To consider the request of the Appellant(s) Mr. Aditya Kashyap and Others on behalf of rest of batches in the Writ Petition No. 9682 of 2020, filed in the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana and Students of the B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) 1st year for Amicable Resolution of Fee Relief (Annexure-2).

Note

Firstly, the students of B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) 2nd Year, 3rd Year, 4th Year and 5th Year have filed the Writ Petition No. 9682 of 2020, in the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana for seeking fee relief during the Covid-19 Pandemic, which is Sub-Judice in the Hon'ble High Court.

On the request of the student's appellant in the above said Petition the Vice-Chancellor constituted the FEE RATIONALIZATION COMMITTEE to work out the possible waiver, keeping in view of University Financial positions and Fee receipt which was discussed with Mr. Aditya Kashyap on June 4, 2021.

(A) Demanded Waiver by the Students/ Petitioner

Mr. Aditya Kashyap a student of B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) Final Year who is one of the Main Plaintiffs in the above case has communicated the following to the University Authorities (Annexure-3):-

"--in light of our discussion earlier today and after wide consultation, we have decided to forego two of our demands namely – "(b) Waiver of Campus Development fee amounting to Rs. 10000; and (d) Adjustment of balance for the unutilized portion of fee of summer semester Feb-May, 2020."

- (ii) The students stated that "... thus, we arrive at the following calculation and are willing to pay the undisputed amount i.e. Amount Rs. 1,28,000/-Rs.128000×900 = Rs. 11.52 crores..."
- (iii) The students further state that "... the relief granted to the LL.M. Batch of 2021 worth Rs. 58,000/- is applicable to the students of B.A. LL.B. (Hons.) as well by virtue of being similarly situated. We thus request that a relief of Rs. 53,000 [Rs.30,000 or Rs. 35,000 (as applicable for double/single occupancy as Hostel Fee) + Rs. 23,000 (Amenities Fee)] be granted to the students."

(B) Assessment of Maintenance Committee

The University has constituted the Hostel Maintenance Assessment Committee to assess

Decision

The Finance Committee considered the recommendations of Hostel Maintenance Assessment Committee, Fee Rationalization Committee, the Saving of University Expenditure, as well as the relief given by various National Law Universities and discussed the same at length in the meeting. After thoughtful discussion, the Finance Committee resolved that the proposed waiver would be Rs. 2,68,36,229/- to all the students of B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) which is as under:

- (i) All the students of B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) be allowed the relief of total Rs. 1,35,33,546 which comes out to be Rs. 14,872/- per head.
- (ii) As worked out by the Maintenance Assessment Committee the maintenance cost of Hostel *i.e.*, Rs. 87,52,709/- will be set-off against waiver by the University.
- (iii) Amounting Rs. 45,50,000/- i.e., Rs. 5000/- per head has already been waived by the Finance Committee/Executive Council in its meeting held on in 20.06.2020 (Para-2) for all batches of B.A.LL.B.(Hons.).

The above relief /waiver are allowed with the expectation that petitioner may withdraw writ petition 9682 of 2020 which



the running cost of the Hostels and the infrastructure created for the students for convenience of the Members of the Finance Committee to consider the request of the students which will be further subject to the withdrawal of the petition in the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana High Court Chandigarh. The estimate cost worked out by the Committee has been recommended as per Annexure-4.

(C) Comparative Statement

Meanwhile, the University has also requested certain National Law Universities to provide the waiver that they have granted to the students in the semester or Annual Fee. The tabulated statement of fee waiver of various National Law School/ Universities is placed as per Annexure-5.

In view of the above 'A', 'B' & 'C' the Hon'ble Members of the Finance Committee are requested to kindly consider the appropriate relief to all the students of B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) as Annexure '1' & '2'.

ITEM (3) To consider the University Grants Commission (UGC) guidelines for promotion of digital payment and enabling convenient digital payment modes throughout the country vide letter D.O. 14-15/2017 (CPP-II) dated 09 June, 2020 (Annexure-6).

It is submitted that the University Grants Commission (UGC) has been issued the new guidelines vide above said DO letter, for promotion of digital payment and enabling convenient digital payment modes throughout the country.

Note

Bharat Bill Payment System is a Reserve Bank of India (RBI) conceptualized system driven by National Payment Corporation of India (NPCI) which offers integrated, accessible and interoperable recurring payment services to consumers. Bharat Bill Payment System is the simplest method for all billers for enabling digital payment. It will help to reduce cash handling charges and will help in easy and timely reconciliation, leading to operational efficiencies.

RBI has decided to expand the scope and coverage of Bharat Bill Payment System to include more categories of billers who raise recurring bills (except prepaid recharges) as eligible participants. This will enable new recurring payment categories to be on-boarded on Bharat Bill Payment System.

All Universities are requested to encourage digital payment of recurring bill through Bharat Bill Payment

Decision

The Finance Committee deliberated on the adoption of Guidelines of the UGC for promotion of digital payment, reducing cash handing charges and enabling convenient digital payment modes and approved the same.

The Finance Committee also recommended it to the Executive Council for its approval.

ITEM (4) To proposed the amendment in the Regulation approved in the AC/EC Meeting, in its meeting held on 20.01.2018, Para-2(10) respectively, with respect to the Research Associate and Research Assistant in the RGNUL, Research Centre(s):

Decision

The University has presently 14 Advanced Researcher The Finance Committee discussed the Centre and each of the Centre has been allotted the two proposed Regulation relating to Salary (02) or more Research Associate and Two (02) or more Research Assistants. The University Academic Council and Qualifications of the Research and Executive Council in its meeting 20.1.2018 decided the qualifications and remunerations. Associate and Assistant and approved Keeping in view of the UGC pay scale and need of them as given below: researchers there is a need to revise the remunerations and their qualifications as above proposed. Research Associate: LL.M. / Post (i) The proposed matter is placed before the Hon'ble Graduate in concerned subject members of Finance Committee for kind consideration, please. (55%), on the fixed salary of Rs. 50,000/- per month. At least One Year of Research/Project Experience will be essential. (ii) Research Assistant: LL.M. / Post-Graduate degree in concerned



subject with 55% marks on the fixed salary of Rs. 40,000/- per month.

The Finance Committee also recommended it to the Executive Council for its approval.

Decision

To propose for procuring multipurpose Credit Card for RGNUL, Punjab from any Bank to be used in India and abroad.

Note	Decision
It is submitted that there is a need to procure a University Credit Card from any Bank for use of University Authorities to meet expenditure of Tour and Travel payment, Hotel payments, Hospitality and purchase of books including any other contingency expenditure etc. This would be used in India and abroad. This will be in line with the practice adopted by many NLU's and other sister organizations. The proposal for University Credit Card to meet contingent expenses is placed before the Hon'ble Members of the Finance Committee for approval, please.	After thoughtful discussion and considering the UGC guidelines for digital payment and reducing cash handing charges, the Finance Committee approved the multipurpose Credit Card for RGNUL from any Bank. The Finance Committee also recommended it to the Executive Council for its approval.

ITEM (6) Approval to allow RGNUL for investment of Funds in FDRs in Banks attracting competitive Higher Rates of Interest.

Note

It is submitted that RGNUL has investment in different funds in FDRs in SBI to the tune of Rs. 67 crores approximately lying in Corpus Fund, Fee A/c, Gold Medal A/c etc.	After thoughtful discussion the Finance Committee in principle allowed the RGNUL for investment of Funds in FDRs
RGNUL has been keeping its all FDRs in the State Bank of India. Finance Committee in its meeting on 09/02/2017 has permitted the relaxation to invest in SBI even if its rate of interest is little less by 0.5% from other banks. It has been observed that University is losing interest income to sizeable amount. The Principal Accountant General in its Audit Report for the period 04-2018 to 03-2020 has also shown concern over the loss of interest by ignoring banks offering higher rates. They have observed that the financial benefit of the University should be taken up on top priority. It is, therefore, proposed that University be permitted to	in reputed Banks, which are offering higher rates of interest. However, Finance Committee suggested that note of caution must be exercised in selecting the Bank for this purpose. And also recommended it to the Executive



invest its funds at competitive rates in any public sector/private banks.

The matter is placed before the Hon'ble Members of the Finance Committee for kind approval please.

ITEM (7) For waiving off 25% of rent for Vendor of Verka Booth, Shop No. 4 & Mess Contractors of Boys & Girls Hostel of the RGNUL Campus, Patiala, till the classes resume.

Note	Decision
Finance Committee in its meeting of June 2020 approved to get 25% of the rent from the Shops and other Mess/Canteen establishments due to Covid-19. It was expected at that time that situation would improve by August 2020 and normal functioning would resume but it did not happen. All the vendors did not enter into any agreement with the University. However, the Verka Booth vendor and one Mr. Prabhjot Singh of Shop No. 4, were asked by the University Authorities to supply essentials to the residents in the University which they have been doing. Also, the mess contractors have run the messes of boys and girls hostel with less than 10% of the capacity from 01/03/2021 to 17/04/2021. Therefore, it is proposed that running cost of the shop may be charged in place of 25% till the classes resume. The matter is placed before the Hon'ble Members of the Finance Committee for kind consideration please.
