FROM THE VICE CHANCELLOR'S DESK


Dear Recruiters,


ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law (RGNUL), Punjab was established by the State Legislature of Punjab by passing the Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab Act, 2006 (Punjab Act No. 12 of 2006). The Act established a University of Law of national stature in Punjab, thereby fulfilling the need for a centre of excellence in legal education in the modern era of globalization and liberalization. The University is registered with the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi under Section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and has been declared fit to obtain grant from the (UGC) under Section 12-B of the UGC Act, 1956 and also acquired approval of the Bar Council of India (BCI) in July 2006. Located in the lush green corridors of Patiala, Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law spreads over an area of 47 acres.

CURRICULUM

RGNUL is known for its allencompassing curriculum, covering a wide range of subjects and sciences for the students to explore and utilise for developing their skills. In the initial semesters, the Batch has been exposed to two international languages – English and French – to pay emphasis on their literary and speaking skills. Also, in keeping with the nature of the course, the students have been provided the opportunity to major in one of the three social sciences of Economics, Political Science and Sociology, including a minor subject of History. In the fourth year, the students are required to select one particular stream for the purposes of specialization – Business Law, Criminal Law, Constitutional Law and International Law along with Optional subjects in which top 30 % students are given opportunity to opt for Term Paper.

PLACEMENT PROCEDURE

The following steps have been enumerated by the Placement Cell to streamline the recruitment process for the Recruiter as well as the students.

Step 1: Initial communication with the Recruiter

The Placement Cell shall send invitations to the organizations along with the Placement Brochure and relevant information. Alternatively, an organization may send description of potential career opportunities to placementcell2020@rgnul.ac.in

Step 2: Pre-Placement Talks

We encourage Pre Placement Talks (PPT) by the recruiter with the interested candidates. The PPTs provide an opportunity for students to learn more about the recruiter including its vision, career prospects and work culture among other things. However, the same is subject to the discretion of the recruiter.

Step 3: Pre-Interview Screening Process

If the recruiter deems appropriate, a Pre Interview Screening Process may be conducted prior to the final interview. The process may include group discussions, telephonic or skype interviews, written questionnaires or any other process that the recruiter considers necessary.

Step 4: Final Interview

Following the PPT and the Pre - Interview Screening Process, the recruiter is required to submit a list of shortlisted candidates. The recruiter may also formulate a waitlist of students who may be interviewed if the selected applicant is unavailable for the interview.

Step 5: Intimation of Offers

The recruiter is required to intimate offer(s) made to the students solely through the Placement Committee. If the recruiter deems appropriate, a waitlist may be disclosed along with the final offers.

NOTE:

- 1. Recruiters are encouraged to visit the RGNUL campus for the placement process. However, in case a recruiter is unable to visit, any session including the Pre-Placement Talks, Pre Interview Screening Process or Final Interviews can be conducted through video-conferencing or any other suitable method.
- 2. The Recruiter is required to communicate with the Placement Cell through the contact details provided at the end of the Brochure. The Cell will assist the recruiter with the recruitment process as well as the travel and accommodation requirements.
- 3. The Placement Cell is the sole body authorised to communicate with the recruiters and any attempt by the applicant to engage in personal communication is barred. The decision of the Placement Cell regarding selection of candidates shall be final and binding on all parties.
