**NLIU, Bhopal wins 2023 NHRC-RGNUL Human Rights
National Moot Court Competition
24th-26th February 2023**

The 2023 NHRC-RGNUL Human Rights National Moot Court Competition was organised from 24th – 26th February, 2023 in the premises of Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab. This moot court competition was conducted in collaboration with National Human Rights Commission, New Delhi. A total of 33 teams from all over India participated in the competition. The competition commenced with draw of lots and exchange of memorials on 24th February. Further, the teams participated in two intellectually demanding and gruelling preliminary rounds which were adjudged by an eminent panel of academicians and practising advocates on 25th February. These rounds were then followed by the quarter-final and semi-finals rounds. The teams were thoroughly tested on their knowledge of law and facts. The two teams which sustained the semi-finals were Christ University, Bangalore and National Law Institute University, Bhopal.

The final rounds were conducted on 26th February and were presided over by a three Judge Bench consisting of Hon'ble (Mr.) Justice Darshan Singh, Former Judge, Punjab and Haryana High Court, Dr. Upneet Lalli, Deputy Director, Institute of Correctional Administration, Chandigarh and Prof. Kamaljit Kaur, Professor of Law, RGNUL.

National Law Institute University, Bhopal won the first prize. They were awarded a cash prize of Rs. 40,000. Christ University, Bangalore was declared as runner-up. They were awarded a cash prize of Rs. 30,000. The Best Speaker (Male) and (Female) was awarded to Mr. Farhaan Khan from Jamia Millia Islamia, Delhi and Ms. Sharanya Chowdhury from Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow. The Best Memorial (Applicant) prize was won by Institute of Law, Nirma University, Ahmedabad and the Best Memorial (Respondent) prize was won by Dr. Ram Manohar Lohiya National Law University, Lucknow. Mr. Joseph Antony from Symbiosis Law School, Hyderabad was adjudged as the best researcher and he was awarded a cash prize of Rs. 10,000.
