CASH INTERNSHIP REPORT DECEMBER, 2021

In the month of December 2021, Centre for Advanced Studies in Humanitarian Law (CASH) conducted a research internship program in the field of International Humanitarian Law (IHL) and International Criminal Law (ICL). After an extensive and robust selection process, one student was selected for the prestigious internship. Ritwik Mahanti from KIIT School of Law Bhubaneswar, Odisha was selected for this internship. He argued for the creation of a Bonsai Democracy in Afghanistan, countering the idealistic demands of western countries of a full-fledged democracy as it is too un-pragmatic and non-acceptable to conservative ethnic groups of Afghanistan such as Pashtuns.

Apart from the cutting edge research, he has also contributed to the blog wing of the CASH centre. He was also a part of numerous discussions and study groups conducted by the CASH. Throughout the internship, he had been actively involved in various activities of the centre. The intern's day-to-day tasks have been assigned and monitored by the faculty coordinator in collaboration with the student convenor, CASH. This research internship experience added immense value to the academic rigor of Mr. Ritvik and streamlined his career trajectory in the field of IHL. After successfully completing the internship, he was provided with an internship certificate by the faculty coordinator.
