Which was deferred by the Academic and Executive Council. Now, he has submitted an application (Email) dated July 17, 2021 regarding Thesis Submission.

As per Post-Doctoral Research Regulations *under Para 6* and *Para 6(A)*:

DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME: The minimum and maximum time permissible for completion of the Post-Doctoral Degree shall be as under: Decision

The Members of Academic Council considered the application of Advocate (Dr.) P.C. Markanda and unanimously approved that the candidate will present his research work before the RAC and on the recommendation of RAC he may be allowed to submit the LL.D. Thesis as an exceptional case. However, thesis submission should be allowed after completing the half of the stipulated duration.

- (1) Minimum period shall be Three years and Maximum Five years for both categories i.e. part-time and full time researchers.
- (2) The duration of the Post-Doctoral Research and the time for submission of the thesis shall be counted from the date of Registration of the candidate.

6A. EXTENSION OF TIME: In exceptional circumstances, the Vice-Chancellor, if deems it fit, may extend the period by Six months at a time subject to maximum of One year which shall not exceed the total duration of six year. Thereafter, the registration of the candidate shall be deemed to be cancelled.

Accordingly, he has requested that the period of 3 years required for submission of Post-Doctoral (LL.D.) - 6A. EXTENSION OF TIME: In exceptional circumstances, the Vice-Chancellor, if deems it fit, may extend the period by Six months at a time subject to maximum of One year which shall not exceed the total duration of six year. Thereafter, the registration of the candidate shall be deemed to be cancelled.
- As per the regulation 10 of the Ph.D. Regulation 2017 "for every extension, the candidate shall pay to the University, prescribed fee (i.e. Rs. 8000/-)".
- However, the UGC vide its Guidelines April, 2020 under clause 13 during Covid-19 state that, "The extension of six months may also be considered for those students who are yet to submit their Thesis".
- As per Public Notice No. F.1-10/2020 (CPP-II) dated 16th March, 2021 – Regarding extension of date for submission of thesis for terminal M.Phil./Ph.D. Students:

In continuation to UGC Public Notice dated 3rd December, 2020 on the above mentioned subject, and keeping in view the larger interest of the research scholars, a further extension of six months beyond

30.06.2021, i.e., till 31st December 2021, for submission of thesis by M.Phil/Ph.D. students may be granted by the Universities. Extension of six months, as mentioned above, may also be granted for submitting evidence of publication and presentation in two conferences. However, tenure of fellowship will remain upto five years only.

The case was submitted to the Vice-Chancellor to allow the extension as per the UGC guidelines April, 2020 under clause 13 during Covid-19, and Public Notice No. F.1-10/2020 (CPP-II) dated 16th March, 2021 — Regarding extension of date for submission of thesis for terminal M.Phil./ Ph.D. Students and same was considered by the Vice-Chancellor and allowed the extension of six month period for completion of his Ph.D. Research Work in anticipation approval of the Academic Council.

The UGC Guidelines April 2020 are silent on the extension fee. However, as per RGNUL Regulation extension fee of Rs. 8000/- will be charged.
