Price Media Law Moot Court Competition, 2021-22**. The competition was organized by University of Oxford from 6th to 10th June 2022.

During the South Asia Rounds, RGNUL team was one of the 10 teams to be selected on the basis of Memorial for taking part in the Oral Rounds. The RGNUL Team competed with NUJS Kolkata in the Semi-Finals and NALSAR Hyderabad in the Finals. The team emerged victorious in the South Asia Rounds.
