ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

1. THE VAANI INITIATIVE

"Vaani" is a multi-lingual programme wherein RICE intends to engage students in regular practice and exercise of language, especially local languages, since students in an NLU often lose touch with them, The objective is to develop language skills for the Language Papers which are an essential component of the Mains Examination for judicial and executive civil service recruitment. "Vaani" is aimed at peer-supported language enhancement with the help of activities undertaken by the RICE community in association with all those students who wish to become a part of this initiative and learn from it. The programme is being run through three WhatsApp Groups, one each for Hindi, Punjabi and English language.

A. Daily Practice Questions in the form of polls on WhatsApp Group on following topics:

- A Word of the Day
- An idiom/phrase
- A grammatical problem
- A question on translation (from Hindi and Punjabi to English, or vice versa)

<u>B. Weekly Revision Assignments</u> for each Language (in an MCQ-based format) via Google Form to test the weekly learnings.

<u>C. Weekly Practice Sessions</u> for Local Languages: Peer review & group discussion session for Hindi (on Fridays) and Punjabi (on Saturdays) every week to practice essay writing or comprehension or such other exercise to improve the command on language.

Participation of Students: More than 200 students have joined the VAANI WhatsApp groups till now and are engaging in daily and weekly quizzes to enhance their language skills.





2. Guest Lecture on Law of Punishments under the Indian Penal Code'

A guest lecture was organized by RICE in the online mode, as a law practicum for the students of Substantive Criminal Law from 2nd and 3rd Year of the B.A.LL.B.(Hons.) course, on 4th September 2023 between 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm. The topic for the session was 'Law of Punishment under the Indian Penal Code', which was pondered upon by the resource person, Dr. Juhi Goyal. She is an advocate at the Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh with more than twelve years of experience. Dr. Goyal explained various theories of punishment to the students, such as the deterrent, preventive, retributive, reformative and compensation theories. She then discussed the various kinds of punishment provided under section 53 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, while also dealing with commutation of sentence of life imprisonment under section 55. Supplementary provisions to punishments also formed part of the lecture, including those as given under sections 71-75 of the IPC. In the end, she addressed all the doubts of the students. The session provided the students with an elaborate and comprehensive overview of the concept of punishment under the IPC.

3. Proposed Activities for the Academic Session 2023-24

RICE wishes to further its goal of helping aspirants achieve success in competitive examinations by pursuing the following activities:

a) Sessions by Judicial/Executive Civil Service Officers

RICE plans to invite individuals who have successfully completed the civil services (executive and judicial branch) examination, including alumni of RGNUL, to guide and motivate the students.

b) Resource Persons for Language Practice: RICE intends to engage two resource persons to regularly aid students in developing skills in Hindi and Punjabi Languages. The overwhelming response of student to the Vaani Initiative highlights their need to have an expert to guide them for language preparation for competitive exams on regular basis.





- c) Mock Tests: RICE also plans to conduct mock tests for law subjects so that students can practice answer writing. These answer scripts may be checked by our faculty members.
- **d)** Essay Writing Competitions in Local Languages: RICE also plans to conduct an Intra-University Legal Essay-writing Contest for local languages such as Hindi and Punjabi, which will encourage the study of law in local languages, a much-neglected practice in National Law Universities.
