

The course will start from the 2021-22 session.</p> <p>Officials on the campus said the diploma course was designed for prison officers and its staff. It would introduce prison personnel to a wide range of perspectives on punishment, criminology and victimology.</p> <p>"The curriculum will enhance the understanding of prison employees on matters pertaining to incarceration, correction practices and challenges to the criminal justice system of India," they said.</p> <p>The eligibility for admission to the course is graduation (in any stream) from a recognised university on the basis of merit.</p> <p>The university has also launched the LLM (Executive) programme. Officials said graduates from any discipline with minimum 50 per cent marks were eligible for enrolment to the course.</p> <p>The LLM (Executive) for executives and professionals (from diverse fields) explores IPR, police studies, constitutional, criminal and administrative laws.</p>

Prof. G.S. Bajpai, Vice-Chancellor, RGNUL, Punjab has envisaged new practices in teaching to address the multiple dimensions of higher education.</p> <p>"In addition to the array of core and optional courses, the integration of interdisciplinary study and Law Practicum Series is crucial to bridge the gaps in learning and meet the dynamic demands of legal services," he observed.</p> <p>While addressing the students and the faculty on the commencement of the new session, Prof. Bajpai elaborated on the need to expand and diversify the curriculum to encounter the challenges of learning in the present times.</p> <p>He remarked, "New initiatives in pedagogy that transcend traditional methods of teaching have been adopted by RGNUL to enhance the skills of the students." He assured the new cohorts that RGNUL would continue empowering them with knowledge and skills required for legal services through innovative pedagogy which would adequately compensate for several restraints posed by the pandemic. "The NAAC grade, NIRF position and <i>Swachhta</i> ranking of the University demonstrate achievements of RGNUL," remarked Prof. Bajpai. Referring to students as 'heart of the institute', Prof. Bajpai focussed on the importance of moot and legal aid. Later, he interacted with students and parents.</p> <p>Justice A.K. Sikri, Chief Guest, congratulated students on embarking their journey of legal education at RGNUL. Reminiscing his association with the university, Mr. Sikri reflected on the role of lawyers in upholding the rule of law and bridging the gap between law and society. "Legal Community," he observed, "has to safeguard rights of the marginalized." Citing eminent jurist Nani Palkhivala on real education, Mr. Sikri explained that it enlightens understanding and enriches character. Alluding to Michelangelo's masterpiece of Renaissance sculpture, <i>David</i>, Mr. Sikri said that vitality and courage of character aid in "setting/shaping angel inside the rock".</p> <p>Sh. Mahesh Jethmalani, Member of Parliament and Guest of Honour, in his address, underlined the importance of background reading, in addition to the lectures, for students pursuing degree of law. He deliberated upon the qualities of innovative thinking, patience, morality, diligence and robust passion essential for lawyers. He expanded on the significance of 'initial crawl' and persistent effort to rejuvenate the rotting systems of society. "Lawyers," he said, "are officers of court whose duty is to seek truth and justice." Midha</p> <p>Centre for Criminology, Criminal Justice and Victimology (CCV) RGNUL conducted discussion session on the landmark judgement Karan v. State NCT of Delhi. Justice J.R. Midha, former Judge High Court of Delhi, deliberated on the progressive impact of the judgement. In the lecture titled "Reflection on Emerging Victim Jurisprudence", Justice Midha talked about the procedure laid down by the verdict to ensure dispensation of justice to victims.</p> <p>Justice Midha read the relevant paragraphs (129,149,169) of the judgement to elucidate the manner in which Karan v. State NCT of Delhi has evolved the law. "Victims," he said, "are unfortunately the forgotten people but courts and criminal justice system must consider harm/suffering and recompense them." He highlighted the fact that computing compensation for pecuniary and non-pecuniary loss was essential to provide some solace to the victims. "Justice," he remarked, "is incomplete without compensation."</p>

			<p>Though no monetary compensation can relieve anguish of the victims and their dependants, it enables the victim to start life afresh," he added.</p> <p>Alluding to the multiplier method, parameters of compensation and cases of the Supreme Court, Justice Midha examined the importance of Victim Impact Report. He said that Karan v. State NCT of Delhi laid down a procedure for development of law. The court mandated filing of Victim Impact Report to determine appropriate compensation paid by the convict for causing emotional trauma, physical injury, anxiety, panic or any other harm triggered by the offence. He said that law schools could contribute in a big way by developing student participation mechanism for the implementation of the guidelines provided by the case.</p> <p>Prof. G.S. Bajpai, Vice-Chancellor, RGNUL, who acted Amicus Curiae in Karan v. State NCT of Delhi, also focussed on the right to restitution for victims of crime during the discussion. He reiterated the significance of summary inquiry by Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DLSA) to ascertain impact of crime. "The Delhi High Court's use of Victim Impact Report to determine the quantum of compensation provides relief to victims," he said.</p> <p>Prof. G.S. Bajpai apprised the audience about the status of implementation of directions of Delhi High Court in the states of Punjab and Tamil Nadu. He said CCV RGNUL would create awareness regarding the judgement and directions of the court through student forum.</p> <p>Prof. Naresh Kumar Vats, Registrar, RGNUL, Punjab observed that the invigorating talk ignited the minds of students. 

Prof. Ranbir Singh, former Vice-Chancellor, NLU Delhi and Distinguished Professor at RGNUL, talked about the seismic shift in educational paradigm, from traditional Socratic Method to the blend mode of teaching. While addressing the faculty and students of LL.M., Prof. Ranbir Singh focussed on supplementing the conventional methods of teaching with new instructional strategies. "The Learning Management System has to be enhanced and integrated with new technology to meet the advancements of the century," he said. Prof. Ranbir Singh exhorted the faculty to develop MOOCs, publish research papers in scopus indexed journals and undertake innovative research projects. He also encouraged the faculty to research on the effectiveness of blended learning/ teaching and contribute to University publication.</p> <p>Prof. G.S.
