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SCHEME OF SCHOLARSHIPS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

1. INTRODUCTION:

- 1.1 Education plays a pivotal role in socio-economic empowerment of Persons with Disabilities. Recognizing its crucial role, the Directive Principles of State Policy, in the Constitution of India and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, have underlined the role of the States in realization of the Right to Education for Persons with Disabilities. Article 41 of Part IV (Directive Principles of State Policy) of the Constitution provides that the State shall make effective provisions for securing the right to work, to education and to public assistance in cases of unemployment, old age, sickness and disablement, and in other cases of undeserved want.
- 1.2 Article 46 of Part IV (Directive Principles of State Policy) of the Constitution enjoins upon the State to promote the educational and economic interests of the weaker sections of the people. Article 38(2) of the same Part also enjoins upon the State to minimize inequalities in income and to endeavor to eliminate inequalities in status, facilities and opportunities, not only amongst individuals but also amongst groups of people residing in different areas or engaged in different vocations.
- 1.3 Further, section 31 (I) of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (RPwD) states that “Notwithstanding anything contained in the Rights of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009, every child with benchmark disability between the age of six to eighteen years shall have the

right to free education in a neighborhood school, or in a special school, of his choice”.

- 1.4 Further, Section 32 (2) of the RPwD Act states that the appropriate Government and local authorities shall ensure that every child with benchmark disability has access to free education in an appropriate environment till he attains the age of eighteen years.
- 1.5 To fulfill these mandates, the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Government of India is implementing six scholarship schemes for students with benchmark disabilities namely 1) Pre-matric Scholarship, 2) Post-matric Scholarship, 3) Top Class Education Scholarship, 4) National Overseas Scholarship, 5) National Fellowship and 6) Free Coaching Scheme.
- 1.6 As per Section 2(r) of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 **“Persons with benchmark disability”** means a persons with not less than forty percent of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability there specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by certifying authority. Students with the following specified disabilities defined in the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 will be eligible for the aforesaid scholarships:-

1.7 According to Census 2011, there were 2.68 crore persons with disabilities in India, constituting 2.22 per cent of the total population. This includes persons with visual, hearing, speech, loco-motor, mental retardation, and

other disabilities. Details of persons with disability in India, by type of disability, as per Census 2011 are as under:

1.8 The six components of the scheme “Scholarships for Students with Disabilities” along with the applicable courses are as under:

1. Pre-matric Scholarship (For Classes IX & X)
2. Post-matric Scholarship (For Class XI to Post-Graduate Degree/Diploma)
3. Top Class Education (For Graduate and Post-Graduate Degree/Diploma in notified institutes of excellence in education)

4. National Overseas Scholarship (For Master's Degree/Ph.D. in Institutions/Colleges/Universities abroad)
5. National Fellowship (For M. Phil and Ph.D. in Indian Universities)
6. Free Coaching (For recruitment examinations for Group A, B **and** C posts and entrance examinations for admission to various technical and professional courses).

2. GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY:

The general conditions of eligibility for all the components of the scheme are given below:

- (i) The scholarships are open only to Indian nationals.
- (ii) All six scholarships are open to students with **students with benchmark disability** and having a valid certificate of disability as prescribed under rules issued by the competent authority. Disability is as defined in 'Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016'.
- (iii) Not more than two children with disabilities of the same parents will be entitled to receive benefits of the scheme. Provided, in case the second child is a twin, the scholarship under the schemes will be admissible to the twins.
- (iv) Scholarship for studying in any class will be available for only one year. If a student has to repeat a class, she/he would not get scholarship for that class for a second (or a subsequent) year.
- (v) A scholarship holder under this scheme will not hold any other scholarship/stipend. If awarded any other scholarship/stipend, the student can exercise his/her option, whichever is more beneficial to him/her and should inform the awarding authority through the Head of the Institution

about the option exercised. No scholarship will be paid to the students under this scheme from the date he/she accepts any another scholarship/stipend. The student can however, accept free lodging or a grant or ad-hoc monetary help from the State Government or any other source for the purchase of books, equipment or for meeting the expenses on board and lodging in addition to the scholarship amount paid under this scheme.

- (vi) Scholarship holders who are receiving coaching in any of the pre-examination training centres with financial assistance from the Central Government/ State Government will not be eligible for stipend under the coaching schemes for the duration of the coaching programme.

3. ANNUAL PARENTAL/GUARDIAN'S INCOME:

Pre-matric and Post-matric Scholarship shall be paid to the students whose parents/guardians income from all sources does not exceed **Rs.2,50,000/- (Rupees two lakh fifty thousand only)** per annum.

Top Class Education Scholarship shall be paid to the students whose parents/guardians income from all sources does not exceed **Rs.8,00,000/- (Rupees eight lakhs only)** per annum.

NOTE 1: So long as either of the parent is alive, income of only the parents, as the case may be, from all sources has to be taken into account. Only in the case where both the parents have died, the income of the guardian who is supporting the student in his/her studies has to be taken into consideration. Such students whose parents income is affected due to the unfortunate death of one of earning parents and who comes within the income ceiling prescribed under the scheme as a result of such an incident, shall become eligible for scholarship, subject to fulfilling other

conditions of eligibility, from the month in which such unfortunate incident happened.

NOTE 2: Income declaration of self-employed parents/guardian should be in the form of a certificate issued by Revenue Officers not below the rank of Tehsildar. Employed parents/guardians should obtain consolidated certificate from Revenue Officer for any other additional source of income.

3. (i) Normally the term 'Hostel' is applicable to a common residential building and common mess for the students, run under the supervision of the educational institution authorities. In case, the college authorities are unable to provide accommodation in the college Hostel, an approved place of residence can also be treated as 'Hostel' for the purpose of this scheme. The place will be approved by the Head of the Institution after due inspection and keeping in view the rules and regulations laid down by the University/Institute, if any. In such case, a certificate to the effect that the student is residing in an approved place of residence, as he/she is unable to get accommodation in the school/college hostel should be furnished by the Head of the Institution.

ii) It is further clarified that such deemed hostels should consist of such accommodation as is hired at least by a group of 5(five) students living together, usually with common mess arrangements.

iii) Scholars who are entitled to free boarding and/or lodging will be paid maintenance charge at 1/3rd of hostellers' rate.

4. RESERVATION OF SLOTS FOR GIRL STUDENTS:

50% of the total scholarships available each year shall be reserved for girl candidates. However, in case adequate number of female candidates are not

available or not found eligible as per the terms and conditions of the scheme, the unutilized slots can be utilized by selecting suitable male candidates.

4.1 REQUIREMENT OF AADHAAR:

Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) vide OM No. 17-22/2016-Sch dated 14th march, 2017 has notified Aadhaar as on identity document under section 7 Aadhaar Act, 2016 for all Scholarship Scheme w.e.f.14th March, 2017 UGC henceforth will make provisions for capturing details of Aadhaar, Aadhaar EID and other alternative documents as provided for in the said notification on their respective scholarship portals or otherwise for disbursement of scholarship directly in to the beneficiary's account.

4.2 UNIQUE DISABILITY IDENTITY CARD (UDID):

Students with Disabilities (SwDs) are advised to register for UNIQUE DISABILITY IDENTITY CARD (UDID) as it will be the single document of identification, verification of the specially abled for availing various benefits in future.

5. PUBLICITY OF THE SCHEME & INVITING APPLICATIONS:

Scheme shall be advertised at the appropriate time and will be suitably publicized through print/electronic/social media and website to bring it to the notice of the target group.

6. ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES:

In order to meet expenditure incidental to the implementation of the scheme, a provision not exceeding 3% of the total budget, shall be made for administrative expenditure.

7. FURNISHING OF FALSE INFORMATION:

If any candidate has furnished any false information/document and is established as false, he/she will be debarred from the award and if he/she has availed of it or is availing, an action will be initiated for recovery of the amount spent with 15% compound interest thereon. Such candidate will also be black listed for future and appropriate legal action may be taken against him.

8. JURISDICTION OF THE SCHEME:

The jurisdiction of the Scheme is to provide prescribed financial support to the selected candidates for pursuing education. The Scheme does not cover employment aspects of the awardees and also does not provide for any kind of assistance to the awardees in seeking employment anywhere, after availing the scholarship.

9. LITIGATIONS:

Any litigation on matters arising out of this scheme will be subject to sole jurisdiction of the courts situated in the National Capital Territory of Delhi.

10. CHANGE IN THE PROVISIONS OF THE SCHEME:

Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Govt. of India may, at its discretion, make necessary changes in the provisions of this scheme, as and when felt necessary, with the approval of Secretary, DEPwD in consultation with Financial Adviser concerned.

11. REVIEW OF SCHEME:

Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities may, at its discretion, undertake review of the scheme as and when required.

The guidelines of various components of the scholarship scheme are given hereunder:

12. PRE-MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDENTS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES:

OBJECTIVES:

- (a) To support students with disabilities to study further in order to prepare themselves to earn their livelihood and to find a dignified place for themselves in the society as they face several barriers: physical, financial, psychological in pursuing studies and live with dignity.
- (b) To support students with disabilities for their studies so that the incidence of drop-out, especially in the transition from elementary education to higher education is minimized.
- (c) To improve participation of students with disabilities in classes IX and X and at the pre-matric stage of education.

12.1 NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS:

Number of Pre-matric scholarships to be sanctioned in a year is 25,000.

12.2 ELIGIBILITY CONDITION:

She/he should be a regular, full time student studying in **classes IX and X** in a Government school or in a school recognized by the Govt. or by a Central/State Board of Secondary Education.

12.3 SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT:

Pre-matric scholarship includes the following for complete duration of the course:

- (i) Maintenance allowance
- (ii) Book grant
- (iii) Disability Allowance

12.4 RATES OF SCHOLARSHIP:

12.4.1 PROCEDURE OF APPLICATION AND SELECTION:

- a) Applications will be called for through National Scholarship Portal (www.scholarships.gov.in). Documents uploaded should be in .pdf format.
- b) The applicants should submit application within the last date prescribed for receipt of applications on National Scholarship Portal.
- c) The institutions in which the candidate is studying shall also register itself on the same portal and verify the details provided by the candidate. The nodal officer nominated by the State shall oversee all the applications and process the same on behalf of the State Government who shall digitally sign the final list in PFMS portal for disbursement of scholarship amount to the beneficiaries.
- d) In case a candidate is a permanent resident of one State but studying in another State, his application will be considered under the slot of his home State and his application must be recommended by the Education/Welfare Department of the State of which he is a permanent resident.
- (f) Merit Criteria for Selection:
 - (i) No of slots available to the State
 - (ii) 50% reserved for girls
 - (iii) Percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination.
 - (iv) In case of a tie in percentage of marks, the percentage of disability will be considered, i.e., the candidate with higher percentage of disability will get preference. In case there is still a tie, the age will be considered, i.e., the older candidate will get preference.

12.5 MODE OF DISBURSAL OF SCHOLARSHIP:

The amount of Scholarship will be transferred to the bank account of the beneficiaries through DBT.

12.6 MONITORING:

- a) Monitoring of the scheme will be done by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities through National Scholarship portal.
- b) The State Government shall ensure that the list of beneficiaries, with necessary particulars, is maintained district-wise, and category-wise.
- c) In order to ensure proper accountability, physical verifications at various levels viz Blocks/District/State levels shall, as per the scheme design, be done covering at least 10% of the units, chosen randomly through an algorithm. The list of selected institutions/students for field visit shall be generated in Department only.

13. POST-MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDENT WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES:

13.1 OBJECTIVES:

- a) To support students with disabilities for their studies in classes XI onwards so that the incidence of drop-out, especially in the transition from the secondary to the higher secondary stage is minimized,
- b) To improve enrolment of students with disabilities in Classes XI and XII and at the Diploma/Graduate and Post-Graduate stage of education.

13.2 SCOPE:

Scholarships under this scheme shall be available for studying in classes XI, XII, Post-matriculation Diploma/Certificates and Bachelor's Degree or Diploma in India and Master's Degree/Diploma from any University recognized by UGC/AICTE.

13.3 NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS:

Number of Post-matric scholarships to be sanctioned every year is 17,000.

13.4 ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS:

These scholarships will be given for study of all recognized post-matriculation or post-secondary courses pursued in recognized institutions with the following exceptions:

‘Scholarships are not awarded for training courses like Aircraft Maintenance Engineer's Courses and Private Pilot license Courses. Courses at Training - Ship Dufferin (Now Rajendra), courses of training at the Military College, Dehradun, courses at Pre-examination Training Centres of all India and State levels.’

- (i) Only those candidates who have passed the Matriculation or Higher Secondary or any higher examination of a recognized University or Board of Secondary Education are eligible.
- (ii) Candidates who after passing one stage of education are studying in the same stage of education in different subject e.g. B.Com. after B.A. in other subject will not be eligible. However, students pursuing L.L.B/B.Ed/B.El.Ed. after passing B.A./B.Sc./B.E. etc. are eligible for Post-Matric Scholarship under this scheme.
- (iii) Students who are pursuing two different courses of study simultaneously can avail the scholarship for any one course only provided pursuance of such

courses are permissible under the rules/regulations of the Educational Authority concerned.

- (iv) Students studying in Class XI of the Higher Secondary School courses of Class XII of the Multipurpose High School will not be eligible for it being a continuous school course. However, in cases where Xth class examination of such courses is treated as equivalent to Matriculation and students who after passing Xth class join other courses, such students will be treated as Post-matric students and will be eligible for the award of scholarships.
- (v) Students who after failing or passing the under graduate examinations in Arts/Science/Commerce join any recognized professional or Technical Certificate/Diploma/Degree courses will be awarded scholarships if otherwise eligible. No subsequent failure will be condoned except courses in Group-I (**Table in para 13.6**).
- (vi) Students who pursue their studies through correspondence courses are also eligible. The term correspondence includes distant and continuing education.
- (vii) Employed students whose income combined with the income of their parents/guardian does not exceed the maximum prescribed income ceiling are eligible for Post-matric scholarships to the extent of reimbursement of all compulsorily payable non-refundable fees.

13.5 SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT:

The amount of Post-matric scholarship includes the following for complete duration of the course:-

- (i) Maintenance allowance
- (ii) Disability allowance
- (iii) Reimbursement of compulsory non-refundable fees
- (iv) Book allowance

13.6 MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE:

Note: The scholarship is given for the study of all recognized Post-matriculation or post-secondary courses pursued in recognized institutions, the list of courses grouped (I to IV) is only illustrative and not exhaustive. The State Governments/Union Territory Administrations are, thus, themselves competent to decide the appropriate grouping of courses at their level.

13.6.1 DISABILITY ALLOWANCE:

Rates of Disability allowance admissible for different types disability shall be payable as under:

13.6.2 REIMBURSEMENT OF COMPULSORY NON-REFUNDABLE FEES

Students are paid enrolment/registration fees, tuition fees, games fee, union fee, library fees, magazine fees, Medical Examination and such other fees compulsorily payable by the scholar to the Institution or University/Board. The maximum fee ceiling for **reimbursement of ‘Compulsory Non-refundable Fees’ for Post-matric Scholarship** is Rs.1.50 lakh per annum. Refundable deposits like caution money, security deposit will, however, be excluded.

NOTE: Compulsory non-refundable fee charged by recognized institutions against free and paid seats of recognized courses can be fully reimbursed as per the fee structure approved by the competent State/Central Government authority upto maximum ceiling of Rs.1.50 lakh per annum.

13.6.3 Book Allowance: Rs.1500/- per annum.

13.7 PROCEDURE OF APPLICATION AND SELECTION:

a) Applications will be called for through National Scholarship Portal (www.scholarships.gov.in).

- b) The applicants should submit their application through the on-line system within the last date prescribed for receipt of applications. All requisite documents like photograph, proof of age, disability certificate, income certificate of the parent, tuition fees receipt, last academic qualification certificate, etc. duly filled in the prescribed format are required to be uploaded in the on-line system, if the scholarship amount including tuition fee is more than Rs.50,000/- per annum. Candidates are to ensure that the documents uploaded are in .pdf format otherwise application is liable to be rejected. In case the total scholarship amount is less than Rs.50,000/- supporting documents may be kept in safe custody of Head of School/Institution, keeping in view the connectivity issue that exists in far flung areas.
- c) The institutions in which the candidate is studying shall also register itself on the portal and verify the details provided by the candidates. The nodal officer nominated by the State shall oversee all the applications and process the same on behalf of the State Government who shall digitally sign the final list in Public Finance Management System (PFMS) for disbursement of scholarship amount to the beneficiaries.
- d) Final selection will be done through National Scholarship Portal based on the online verification by the concerned Department of the State Government considering, inter alia, the number of slots available to that particular State.
- e) In case, a candidate is a permanent resident of one State but studying in another State, his application will be considered under the slot of his home State and his application needs the recommendation of the Education/Welfare Department of the State of which he is a permanent resident.
- f) Merit Criteria for Selection:
- (i) No of slots available to the State
 - (ii) 50% slots are reserved for girls.

- (iii) Percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination.
- (iv) In case of a tie in percentage of marks, the percentage of disability will be considered, i.e., the candidate with higher percentage of disability will get preference. In case there is still a tie, the age will be considered, i.e., the older candidate will get preference.

13.8 DURATION AND RENEWAL OF AWARD

- (i) The award once made will be tenable from the stage at which it is given to the completion of the course subject to good conduct and regularity in attendance. It will be renewed from year to year provided that, within the total duration of the course which is continuous for a number of years, the scholar secures promotion to the next higher class irrespective of the fact whether such examinations are conducted by a University or the Institution.
- (ii) If a student with benchmark disabilities pursuing Group I courses indicated in para 13.6.1, (in case of **Post-matric** scholarship) fails in the examination for the first time, the award may be renewed. For second and subsequent failure in any class, the student shall bear his/her own expenses until he/she secures promotion to the next higher class.
- (iii) If a scholar is unable to appear in the annual examination owing to illness or on account of any other unforeseen event, the award may be renewed for the next academic year on submission of medical certificate and/or other required sufficient proof to the satisfaction of the Head of the Institution and his/her certifying that the scholar would have passed had **he/she** appeared in the examination.
- (iv) If according to the Regulations of a University/Institution, a student is promoted to the next higher class even though he/she may not have actually

passed in lower class and is required to take examination of the junior class again after sometime, he/she will be entitled to scholarship for the class to which he/she is promoted if the student is otherwise eligible for scholarship.

13.9 OTHER CONDITIONS

- (i) The scholarship is dependent on the satisfactory progress and conduct of the scholar. If it is reported by the Head of the Institution at any time that a scholar has by reasons of his/her own act of default failed to make satisfactory progress or has been guilty of misconduct such as resorting to or participating in strikes, irregularity in attendance without the permission of the authorities concerned, etc., the authority sanctioning the scholarship may either cancel the scholarship or stop or withhold further payment for such period as it may think fit.
- (ii) If a student is found to have obtained a scholarship by false statements, his/her scholarship will be cancelled forthwith and the amount of the scholarship paid will be recovered, at the discretion of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disability, Government of India. The student concerned will be blacklisted and debarred for scholarship in any scheme forever.
- (iii) A scholarship awarded may be cancelled if the scholar changes the subject of the course of study for which the scholarship was originally awarded.
- (iv) A scholar is liable to refund the scholarship amount at the discretion of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities,

Government of India, if during the course of the year, the studies for which the scholarship has been awarded, is discontinued by him/her.

- (v) Maintenance allowance is payable from 1st April or from the month of admission, whichever is later, to the month in which the examinations are completed, at the end of the academic year (including maintenance allowance during holidays), provided that if the scholar secures admission after the 20th day of a month, the amount will be paid from the month following the month of admission. The maintenance allowance shall be payable for twelve months in an academic year for post-matric scholarship.
- (vi) In case of renewal of scholarships awarded in the previous years, maintenance allowance will be paid from the month following the month up to which scholarship was paid in the previous year, if the course of study is continuous.
- (vii) Scholarship will not be paid for the period of internship/houseman ship in the M.B.B.S. course or for a practical training in other courses if the student is in receipt of some remuneration during the internship period or some allowance/stipend during the practical training in other course.

13.10 MODE OF DISBURSAL OF SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship scheme shall be implemented through the National Scholarship Portal and the amount will be directly credited into the bank account of the beneficiaries through DBT mode.

13.11 MONITORING

- a) Monitoring of the scheme will be done by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities through the National Scholarship Portal.
- b) The State Government shall ensure that lists of beneficiaries, with necessary particulars, are maintained district-wise, and category-wise.
- c) In order to ensure proper accountability, physical verifications at various levels viz Blocks/District/State levels shall,, as per the scheme design, be done covering at least 10% of the units, chosen randomly through an algorithm. The list of selected institutions/students for field visit shall be generated in Department only.

14. TOP CLASS EDUCATION (FOR GRADUATE DEGREE/POST-GRADUATE DEGREE/DIPLOMA IN INSTITUTES NOTIFIED BY DEPwD)

14.1 OBJECTIVES AND ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- To promote quality education amongst students with disabilities by providing financial support for pursuing studies at the level of Graduate and Post-Graduate degree or diploma in notified institutes of excellence in education identified by DEPwD.

14.2 NUMBER OF SLOTS: 300

14.3 QUANTUM OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:

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14.4 PROCEDURE OF APPLICATION AND SELECTION:

- a) Applications will be called for through National Scholarship Portal (www.scholarships.gov.in).
- b) The applicants should submit their application through the on-line system within the last date prescribed for receipt of applications. All requisite documents like photograph, proof of age, disability certificate, income certificate of the parent, tuition fees receipt, last academic qualification certificate, etc. duly filled in the prescribed.pdf format are required to be uploaded on-line, if the scholarship amount including tuition fee is more than Rs.50,000/- per annum. Candidates are to ensure that the documents uploaded are in .pdf format otherwise application is liable to be rejected. In case the total scholarship amount is less than Rs.50,000/- supporting documents may be kept in safe custody of Head of School/Institution.
- c) The institutions in which the candidate is studying shall also register itself on the same portal and verify the details provided by the candidates. The nodal officer nominated by the State shall oversee all the applications and process the same on behalf of the State Government who shall digitally sign the final list in Public Finance Management System (PFMS) for disbursement of scholarship amount to the beneficiaries.
- d) The number of slots available to any State is decided on the basis of percentage of population of PWDs of that State in comparison to the total **PwD** population of India.

- e) In case a candidate is a permanent resident of one State but studying in another State, his application will be considered under the slot of his home State and his application must be recommended by the Education/Welfare Department of the State of which he is a permanent resident.
- f) **Merit Criteria for Selection:**
- (i) No of slots available to the State
 - (ii) 50% slots are reserved for girls.
 - (iii) Percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination.
 - (iv) In case of a tie in percentage of marks, the percentage of disability will be considered, i.e., the candidate with higher percentage of disability will get preference. In case there is still a tie, the age will be considered, i.e., the older candidate will get preference.

14.5 MODE OF DISBURSAL OF SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship scheme shall be implemented through the National Scholarship Portal and the amount will be directly credited into the bank account of the beneficiaries through DBT mode.

14.6 INSTITUTES OF EXCELLENCE:

The list of the reputed Premier Institutions covered under the Scheme is at **Annexure- I**. Any addition or deletion to this list shall be notified by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, as and when required. Scholarship under this scheme shall not be admissible for pursuing distance-learning/part-time/week-end courses under any stream.

One time award – The award cannot be considered for second or subsequent times as the individual can be awarded only once.

14.7 DURATION AND RENEWAL OF AWARD :

The duration of the award of the scholarship shall be ordinarily for the approved tenure of the course in which the candidate has got admission.

- a) The award once made will be tenable from the stage at which it is given to the completion of course subject to good conduct and regularity in attendance.
- b) It will be renewed from year to year within a course which is continuous for a number of years provided the scholar secures promotion to the next higher class irrespective of the fact whether such examinations are conducted by a University or the Institution.
- c) If a scholar is unable to appear in the annual examination owing to illness and or on account of any other unforeseeable event, the award may be renewed for the next academic year on submission of medical certificate and/or other required sufficient proof to the satisfaction of the Head of the Institution and his/her certifying that the scholar would have passed had he appeared in the examination.
- d) If according to the Regulations of a University/Institution, a student is promoted to the next higher class even though he/she may not have actually passed in lower class and is required to take examination of the junior class again after sometime, he/she will be entitled to scholarship for the class to which he/she is promoted if the student is otherwise eligible for scholarship.

14.8 OTHER CONDITIONS:

- (i) The scholarship is dependent on the satisfactory progress and conduct of the scholar. If it is reported by the Head of the Institution at any time that a

scholar has by reasons of his/her own act of default failed to make satisfactory progress or has been guilty of misconduct such as resorting to or participating in strikes, irregularity in attendance without the permission of the authorities concerned etc., the authority sanctioning the scholarship may either cancel the scholarships or stop or withhold further payment for such period as it may think fit.

- (ii) If a student is found to have obtained a scholarship by false statements, his/her scholarship will be cancelled forthwith and the amount of the scholarship paid will be recovered, at the discretion of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Government of India. The student concerned will be blacklisted and debarred for scholarship in any scheme forever.
- (iii) A scholarship awarded may be cancelled if the scholar changes the subject of the course of study for which the scholarship was originally awarded unless such change in course of study has been approved by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities.
- (iv) A scholar is liable to refund the scholarship amount at the discretion of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Government of India, if during the course of the year, the studies for which the scholarship has been awarded, is discontinued by him/her.
- (v) Maintenance allowance is payable from 1st April or from the month of admission, whichever is later, to the month in which the examinations are completed, at the end of the academic year (including maintenance allowance during holidays), provided that if the scholar secures admission

after the 20th day of a month, the amount will be paid from the month following the month of admission.

- (vi) In case of renewal of scholarships awarded in the previous years, maintenance allowance will be paid from the month following the month up to which scholarship was paid in the previous year, if the course of study is continuous.

14.9 REVIEW AND MONITORING:

The progress of implementation of the scheme will be reviewed by a Screening Committee consisting of the following:–

- b) Joint Secretary concerned in Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, - Member
- c) Joint Secretary & Financial Adviser (in-charge of Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities) - Member
- d) Joint Secretary(TD), Min. of Tribal Affairs - Member
- e) Joint Secretary (SCD), Deptt. of SJ&E - Member
- f) Joint Secretary, Department of Higher Education - Member
- g) Joint Secretary, Department of Medical Education, Min. of Health & FW - Member

- h) A representative of the UGC - Member
- i) Director / Dy. Secretary concerned in - Convener
Department of Empowerment of Persons
with Disabilities

The Committee may invite an expert as a special invitee, as and when it deems necessary.

The Committee may recommend to the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities about addition or deletion of any institution based on their performance. For the purpose, the committee may take into account the recommendations of the concerned bodies conducting entrance examination for admissions into such courses or having the administrative control over such institutes.

The Committee may periodically review the performance of the selected institutes on the basis of the academic results.
