10th RGNUL National Moot Court Competition
(1-3 April 2022)

The Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab in association with Late Lala Dip Chand Memorial Trust organised 10th RGNUL National Moot Court Competition from 1-3 April 2022. The competition was conducted virtually. 50 teams across the nation participated in the competition. Eminent judges and senior advocates adjudged the preliminary and final rounds. The moot proposition was drafted by Prof. Dr. Suman Dash Bhattamishra, Asst. Professor of Law, NLU Odisha.

The final rounds were presided over by a two-Judge Bench, Justice SS Saron, Former Judge Punjab and Haryana High Court and Mr. Sumeet Goel, Senior Advocate Punjab and Haryana High Court. Prof. G.S.
