RGNUL commemorates Constitution Day 26th November 2022

The Centre for Constitutional Law and Governance (CCLG), Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab commemorated the adoption of Constitution of India on 26 th November 2022. Faculty, students and staff of the university recited the Preamble of Constitution to reiterate the resolve of sovereign democratic republic envisioned by Indian leaders. Prof. G.S. Bajpai, Vice-Chancellor, RGNUL said, “The Constitution provides guidelines for good governance, enjoins state to promote peace, envisions social order based on justice and empowers the citizens of India.” Prof. Anand Pawar, Registrar, RGNUL said, “Pledging allegiance to the democratic ideologies engendered constitutional values.” Earlier this week during Constitution Day celebrations, special lecture on “Envisioning Constitutional Framework in Metaverse” was delivered by Mr. Vikramjit Banerjee, Additional Solicitor General of India & Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India. He reflected on the legal system and constitutional framework required for catching up with digital advances. He dwelled on responsible habits of conduct, consumption and creation in the virtual ecosystem. Mr. Banerjee said, “The interaction between people and virtual environment raises concerns for transparent data policies laws to regulate digital rights and digital citizenship.” While reminding the participants of ancient Indian history characterised by rule of law, Mr. Banerjee spoke about rules for the metaverse. He deliberated on drastic shift in governance heralded by technology. “Metaverse-related issues and advancements in augmented/virtual reality could greatly harm human interest,” he added. While addressing the audience, Prof. G.S. Bajpai, Vice-Chancellor, RGNUL said, “Since the development of metaverse application globally is in nascent stage, there is a need to underpin laws and policies to provide security to human beings in times of immersive technologies.”
