Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law (RGNUL), Punjab was established by the State Legislature of Punjab by passing the Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law Punjab Act, 2006 (Punjab Act No. 12 of 2006). RGNUL started functioning from its Headquarters - Mohindra Kothi, the Mall, Patiala w.e.f. 26 May 2006. The University acquired approval of the Bar Council of India (BCI) in August 2006. The University got registered with the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi under Section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and also got recognition under Section 12-B of the said Act in the very formative year. The RGNUL is a regular member of Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi and several other prestigious national and international institutions/organizations.

When established it functioned from Mohindra Kothi, a heritage building situated in the centre of the city Patiala. However the administrative and the academic wing of the College along with the hostel and faculty quarters have now been shifted to the new campus situated on the outskirts of the city in village Sidhuwal. The new campus is spread over in approximately 47.30 acres of land and is being developed as a Green University by putting in latest technology for rain water harvesting, construction of sewage treatment plant, plantation of trees and installation of solar system, etc. The campus has a perfect blend of technological advancement and environmental protection.

A state-of-the-art Campus have an Administrative-cum-Academic Block, separate spacious Library Building, Auditorium, Sports Complex, Blocks of Boys and Girls Hostels, Guest House, Community Hall, Health Centre, Residences, Stadium, Shopping Complex, Bank and other facilities. Hostels are facilitated with modern amenities including air conditioning of each room. Faculty members are also residing in the houses allotted to them at the New Campus.

There are three advanced Computer Labs at the campus with leased line internet connectivity. The whole campus is wi-fi enabled. The facility is also extended to the respective hostels round the clock. The University has also set up various Centres of Advanced Study.

The School of Law of the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), New Delhi has also set up a Programme Study Centre at RGNUL, Patiala. The RGNUL Legal Aid Clinic has been established at the RGNUL Campus under the aegis of Punjab State Legal Services Authority. Under the XI Plan guidelines of UGC, RGNUL has also established RGNUL Enabling Unit and the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The University has entered into MoUs with many National / International institutes for academic and professional collaboration.

In a short span of time, the University has progressed by leaps and bounds not only in academics but also in development of infrastructure at its campus at Sidhuwal Patiala.


STUDENT LIFE



EVALUATION & MARK DISTRIBUTION

The evaluation system at RGNUL comprises of a rigorous system of examinations, project reports, viva voces, seminar presentations and moot courts. At the end of every semester, each student is marked out of a total of 100 for every subject which factors in their examinations, project reports, viva voces and seminar presentations, thereby making 600 marks the grand total of every semester.

In the first six semesters, the marks in every subject are divided as displayed in the pie chart. Out of the total of 100, 30 marks are for project and viva voce, 40 are for the end semester examinations, 15 are for the seminar presentations, 10 are for the mid semester examinations and 5 are for class behavior and attendance.

The marking criteria is changed from the fourth year onwards to reflect the nuances of every specialization. Out of a total of 100, 80 marks are for the end semester examinations and 20 marks are for the mid semester examinations. Project Report and Moot Court is a separate paper where the project report and viva voce counts for 50 marks out of 100 and the performance in the Moot Court is the remaining 50 out of 100. The Grade Point system followed in the University is as follows.
