

About the University

Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law(RGNUL), Punjab, was established by the State Legislature of Punjab by passing the RGNUL, Punjab Act, (Punjab Act No. 12 of 2006). The Act incorporated a University of Law of national stature in Punjab, thereby fulfilling the need for a Centre of Excellence in legal education in the modern era of globalization and liberalization. RGNUL campus is situated at Sidhuwal, Bhadson Road, Patiala (Punjab) which is about 70 km from Chandigarh. The University acquired approval of the Bar Council of India (BCI) in August 2006. The University got registered with the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi under Section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and also got recognition under Section 12-B of the UGC Act.

In 2015, RGNUL became the first and the only NLU to have been accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with an 'A' grade. In 2018, RGNUL was amongst the four NLUs to have been granted autonomous status by the University Grants Commission and has been ranked among the top law schools in India in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF).In Swachh Campus Rankings 2019 RGNUL has been adjudged First Rank (Cleanest) in the Country among Government Residential Universities by MHRD.



ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

Modern sports are often multi-billion-pound ventures, with global spectators consumers - with priceless commodities being traded and marketed. With the steady growth and expansion of the sports industry, the capability of traditional models of governance of sports activities to deal with contemporary issues is under scrutiny. This course aims to explore the legal challenges that sports faces both at national as well as international level and this course aims at developing possible solutions for the said challenges. The course will inter alia comprise discussions on pertinent current issues such fixing and gambling, spot controversies, sports and broadcasting law, dispute resolution of sports disputes. Further, this course will contain discussions on possible legal challenges that sports may pose in the near future in India and lessons that India can draw from the experience of development of sports law internationally. Sports Law in India course aims to provide participants with an in-depth understanding of the complex legal landscape that governs the world of sports within the Indian context.



Course Objectives

This course is designed to:

- To provide insights into the contractual, commercial and intellectual property aspects of sports law.
- To analyse the ethical, gender related, and discrimination issues prevalent in sports domain.
- To offer participants a platform to engage in discussion about dispute resolution mechanism in sports.
- To familiarise participants with legal principles & regulations governing sports in India.
- To explore the diverse legal issues and challenges faced by sports person in India.

Eligibility

- a. Bachelor's Degree or an equivalent Degree in any discipline from any recognized University; or
- b. Candidates who complete three years of their 5-Year Integrated Degree Programme are also eligible to apply; or
- c. Candidates appearing for the final year examination of Graduation are also eligible to apply.
- d. 10+2 or equivalent

Admission

Direct Admission subject to fulfilment of the eligibility criteria.

Duration of the Programme

The duration of the programme is three months. and the Programme is to be completed within 1 year. If the candidate does not pass or complete the course, his/ her enrollment ceases. He will have to register afresh by following the usual procedures prescribed for first admission. His performance at the earlier exams is not carried forward. He will have to redo the entire academic exercise prescribed, in the syllabus.

Fees Structure

Course fee: Rs. 3500/- + GST

Note: The University reserves the right to revise the Fee structure from time to time.

Conduct of the programme

The Certificate Programme will be for a period of three months in Online mode. Relevant course material will be sent to the registered IDs of the students from time to time. Each subject shall consist of 8 teaching hours which will come to 32 teaching hours for the total programme. The learners are expected to put in at least 25 hours of study for the Course.

The Registered email will be the main delivery system in terms of updating the information on the subject.

Evaluation scheme & Award of Certificate

After the completion of the course, There will be one examination for each subject. Each paper shall carry 50 marks. It shall be mandatory to obtain a minimum of 50% marks in the Assessments for successful completion of the course. Only the candidates, who obtain 50% marks in the said assessment will be eligible for the certificate. The candidates obtaining less than 50% marks will not be awarded the certificate.

Please note that a candidate can attempt that Assessment only once. No Repeat examination shall be conducted in any case. The candidates are required to score at least 50% of marks (as mentioned above) to complete the Certificate Course and become eligible for the issue of the Certificate.

Refund of Fee in case of withdrawal of admission
