RGNUL proposes to initiate Two-Year Law Intensive MBA Degree Programme - M.B.A. (Law-Hons.). With a view to prepare the scheme and regulations, a Committee of faculty was constituted. The University has been consistently incentivizing the research activity in areas related to Law and Social Sciences. The RGNUL has established different Research Centers to achieve the aim and objectives to achieve high standards in education. In this regard, the RGNUL faculty members have submitted the proposal to establish the different Centers.

Decision

The Members of the Academic Planning Board perused the concept note for creation of above Centres at RGNUL, Punjab and unanimously approved the same. And also recommended to Centre Heads to propose the Chairs on Consumer Law, DIPP-IPR Chair and Chair on Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, etc. The Members also recommended the creation of a set of guidelines for the close monitoring and evaluation of the working of the Centres including the fixing of accountability of the Centre Heads and to also develop an academic calendar of activities.

The Members of the Academic Planning Board recommended the above said Items to Academic Council for its approval.
