

RGNUL wins World Rounds of International Moot Court Competition

2018 has marked the closing of a stellar academic session for Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab. The University has been long reckoned as one of the premier legal institutions of the country and adding another feather to the cap, four teams qualified for the international rounds of some of the most competitive moots across the world.

The team comprising of Madeeha Majid, KS Roshan Menon and Arvind Kumar were adjudged Winners at the Ninth Leiden Sarin Air Law Moot Court Competition, held at the Incheon Aviation Academy, South Korea and made history by being the first team from RGNUL to have won the World Rounds of an International Moot. After qualifying for the World Rounds in February, the team argued four rounds of Semi Finals, against universities from the Netherlands, Poland, Singapore and Indonesia. The Final Round was held between SMU, Singapore and RGNUL, and was presided over by Laurens Jan Brinkhorst, former Deputy Prime Minister of the Netherlands, who declared RGNUL the Winners of the Competition.

Another team comprising of Raghav Mendiratta, Shreya Tewari, Pradeep Singh Khichi, Shaurya Dhaundiya and Varsha Singh brought laurels to the University by doing a clean sweep at the South Asian Round of the Oxford Price Media Moot Court Competition, 2018. The team was the overall winner, it also won best memorial and Shreya Tewari bagged the award for best speaker. This was shortly followed by them representing the University in the world rounds of the moot conducted at the Oxford University where they were adjudged Semi-Finalists and both the speakers Raghav and Shreya were amongst the top ten speakers at the world rounds with Shreya bagging the 3rd position and Raghav, the 10th position.

Furthermore, the team comprising of Anmol Malhotra, Uday Agnihotri, and Raghav Mudgal were adjudged winners of the first edition of the H V Perera QC Memorial International Moot Court Competition of Sri Lanka. They also received the awards for the best written submissions from the claimant and respondent side.

Students portray the will and zeal of the institution and here's hoping that the constant hard work that the students have exhibited only continues to make them and the institution shine.
