But the other attesting witness is bed ridden and unable to perform his duties in normal course of life. Thus, the witness is unable to come to the court. Explain the procedure what should 'X' do so that the statement of the witness is recorded?
2. 'P' created a trust for charitable purposes and handed over the property to the trustees. The trustees did not perform the act for the purpose for which the trust was made, for more than 12 years. After that 'P', died and then after 28 years, 'L' who was a beneficiary filed a suit against the trustees for getting back the possession of the property of trust. Discuss whether the suit is within limitation period or not.

- 3.a) A police constable was dismissed by the DIG, Police from service. The police constable filed a writ in the High Court for quashing the dismissal order on the grounds that the dismissal order was against principles of Natural Justice and he had not been given opportunity of being heard. However, the High Court found that the record showed that the police constable had been given 4 opportunities to put forward his case. So, the writ was dismissed. Later on, the police constable filed another writ on the grounds that he had been appointed by the Inspector General of Police but the DIG Police had dismissed him and since only the appointing authority has power of dismissal, the order dismissing him from service should be quashed. Now, you decide if the High Court would entertain second writ. Illustrate your answer with a decided case. (7.5 marks)
- b) 'A', is a drycleaner and 'X', is his customer. 'X', has an account with 'A'. The account shows a debit balance. So the dry cleaner files a suit for recovery. However 'X' takes a defense that the drycleaner has spoilt his two costly suits in the course of his business. The cost of the suits can't be ascertained. Explain what should 'X', file apart from the Written Statement to claim the damages in the same suit. (7.5 marks)

- 6.a) The general rule under the Limitation Act,1963 is that once the cause of action has accrued time starts running but due to Legal Disability the delay may be condoned by the court and under section 6, Limitation Act,1963 there are 5 conditions when the time period may be condoned . Explain these five conditions in a simple language with help of 5 illustrations one for each sub section. (7.5 marks)
- b) A gives a loan to B of Rs 1 lakh on 1-1-19 for a period of one year. Now, the due date of payment is 01-01-2020. But, B does not make the payment. - 1) Ramu and Moni were married in 1990 and out of the wedlock two children were born. Ramu lived in Patna in connection with his job and Moni with her children and in laws in Delhi. In Patna, Ramu developed an extra-marital relationship with Teji and tried to take the consent of his wife Moni to marry Teji. On refusal of Moni to give consent, physical and mental torture was perpetrated against her by Ramu. After a few days Ramu went back to Patna. He stopped contacting his wife and children and also stopped sending money to them. He starts living with Teji. After two years Moni's body was found hanging on a ceiling fan. Her children made a statement before the police that mental trauma inflicted by their father led to the mishap. Discuss and decide in the light of IPC provisions.
  
- 2) X was in the habit of sexually assaulting minor girls and the same was often facilitated by his wife. One day 'A'(12 years) and 'B'(16 years) two minor girls were lured in the house by X's wife on some pretext. She (X's wife) locked the room from outside and stood guard while X undressed himself and forced the girls to do the same. He touched both of them on their private parts and was about to commit rape on the 12 years old girl (the act was short of penile Penetration) when his wife raised an alarm that villagers are coming towards their house. Discuss the matter in the light of relevant statutory provision contained in IPC, 1860.

- 5 a) The accused claimed to possess supernatural divine healing power through his touches, particularly of chronic diseases. 'X' approached the accused for healing his 12 year old daughter who was congenitally a dumb child. 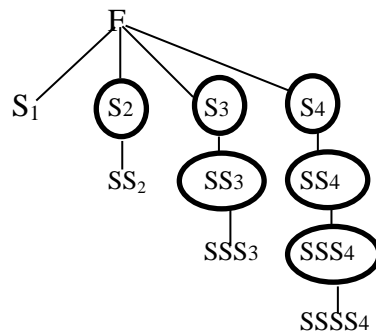
