

When the two were performing at the same venue, Smith, in his dressing room, "heard one of [his] songs playing" and rushed out to see Thomas performing 'MUJHE JUNGLEE KAHO'. Smith confronted Thomas, who admitted to sampling. As the two negotiated after "MUJHE JUNGLEE KAHO" went viral. Thomas uploaded a music video, which got millions of views, and articles were written about his "meteoric rise". Eventually, Thomas stopped acknowledging Smith's contribution to this. Advise Mr. Smith to claim his legal rights against Thomas and liabilities of Thomas under Copyright Law.


3. Kaler Hundi, the most famous pop star hailing from Punjab and sung song composed by Rozer Hundi who became immensely popular amongst Punjabi-pop music lovers. The appellant Kaler Hundi Company was incorporated in 1996 to manage the artist's escalating career. Rozer Hundi due to his ill health left composing the songs after being paid full and final lump sum amount of Rs. Five Lac as royalty of his work on July 10, 2000. Kaler continued enjoying the reputation and royalty of his songs and got invitation from Abu Salim performing those songs in Film. Kaler Hundi Company and Abu Salim launched famous songs composed by Rozer Hundi in 'Brother Hundi' Film which was released on October 9, 2005 which won award of the year for its success and earned highest profit. The defendants Mini Hundi daughter of Rozer Hundi an advocate filed suit for claiming royalty of composed songs by Rozer Hundi which was opposed by Kaler as having paid full and final lump sum amount. Decide the legal Rights of Rozer Hundi as composer and liability of Kaler Hundi in the given case under Copyright Law.

4. CopZee Limited started its business in manufacturing and processing of 'MALAI CREAM' biscuits in March 2010 in NCR Delhi without Registration of Trade Mark and could supply the demand of One Ton Biscuits in first

month and later on CopZee could not maintain its book of accounts and supply order. ZEBRA Co. applied for Trademark in March 2010 got registered its Trademark 'MALAI WALA' for manufacturing and production of 'MALAI WALA' Bakery products on May 7, 2010 and started production and marketing its biscuits and cakes on June 1, 2010 in Delhi which gave the good competition in the market even on other bakery items. CopZee Limited filed a suit for injunction against ZEBRA Co. and filed an opposition for grant of MALAI WALA Trademark. Comment upon the rights of defendant for Trademark and how will you advise CopZee in succeeding its claims for passing off.

The Will has not been denied by any of the parties.





However, the assessee submitted before the Assessing Officer that he had only signed those documents by virtue of Power of Attorney executed by two NRIs S and B, the original vendors of such sale transactions and no money was credited to his bank account. A show-cause notice was issued directing the assessee to explain as to why capital gain should not be taxed in the hands of the assessee on the premise that the residential address of the vendors was not furnished by the assessee neither the vendors filed their return of income. The Assessing Officer considered the assessee as the owner of the property and added the amount to the income of the assessee towards capital gain. Discuss the legality of the action taken by Assessing Officer.

b. The assessee, a co-operative society, filed its return of income. The assessee had derived income from letting out some space on terrace for installation of mobile towers/antenna which was offered "as income from house property". Further, against such income the assessee had claimed deduction under section 24(a). However, the Assessing Officer observed that, the terrace could not be termed as house property as it was the common amenity for members. He also observed that the annual letting value of the terrace was not ascertainable. Accordingly, he concluded that the income received by the assessee from the mobile companies towards installation of mobile towers/antenna was to be treated as "income from other sources" and no deduction was allowable under section 24(a). Discuss the legality of action taken by Assessing Officer.

c. Mr Sharma invests Rs 10 lakh in a fixed deposit (FD) at a bank, in his wife's name. Interest of Rs. 1 lakhs arises on this income. Mrs Sharma invests the interest on periodic basis and interest for an amount of Rs. 5,000 arises on the interest deposited by her in bank. Analyze the clubbing provisions and find out the taxability of interest accrued.

d. Mr. Shameer and Mrs. Khushi have projected to earn a taxable income of Rs. 5,50,000 and 15,00,000 for the assessment year in which the slab rate is as follows:

Up to 5,00,000	Nil
5,00,001 to 10,00,000	10%
10,00,001 and above	20%

Compute the advance tax instalments payable by both the assesses.
